

Praying for our Deceased

There are different ways we can pray for our deceased. We can pray for them at anytime we pray, we can pray for them when we visit their remains in the cemetery, and we can pray for them at Mass. At mass, in the quiet time before mass [remember the Instructions to the Roman Missal asks us to be in our pew five minutes before mass to prepare for meeting the Lord] we can make an intention that we offer our participation of the mass for the happy repose of N. We can also as we are participating at mass, make an intention of asking God to grant happy repose to N after the “Let us pray”, in the quiet time before the Collect Prayer at the beginning of mass. We can during the Universal Prayer of Mass, when we provide time for us to pray in our heart for an intention - pray for the happy repose of N. We can also have an intention for the priest who is the celebrant of the mass to include in his intentions of the mass, the happy repose of N. Remember St. Monica’s words to her sons of which St. Augustine was one: “Bury my body wherever you will; let not care of it cause you any concern. One thing only I ask you, that you remember me at the altar of the Lord wherever you may be.” We pray for all our faithful departed at every mass and we can pray for a singular faithful departed at any mass, as the mass is the one sacrifice of Jesus Christ.

Mass Intentions Book for 2022 and Mass Intentions

The Mass Intentions Book for 2022 is opened for parishioners to schedule mass intentions for the priest of the mass. Some may be confused according to the system of mass intentions used in the Diocese of Lafayette. Let me summarize these: There are three ways of accepting mass intentions. The pastor of the parish decides which one to use. **These three are: (1) Individual Intentions, (2) Collective Intentions, and (3) Group Intentions.** For Individual Intentions, a single intention is accepted for each mass said in the parish. For Collective Intentions, a single intention is said for each mass except two masses of the week where many intentions are collected together. In the case of Collective Intentions, the total amount of mass offerings exceeding a single intention is sent to the diocese for the assistance of needy parishes. For Group Intentions, intentions are collected in a group. In this case, the total amount of mass offerings exceeding a single intention is sent to other priests either retired who are in need of intentions or priests in mission lands who are in need of intentions. These mass intentions sent are said for the intentions of the donors. The number of these masses said equals the offerings exceeding a single intention.

In keeping with the decision of former pastors, we use **the Group Intentions** for mass intentions for the priest here at Nativity of Our Lady. So to make it clearer let me review in dollars what happens in Group Intentions. The donation for mass intentions in the Diocese of Lafayette is five (5) dollars per mass per intention. In group intentions, let us say that three intentions are given for a mass. These could be Edward Smith, Mary Jones, and Edith Henry. At five dollars an intention, fifteen dollars were donated ($3 \times \$5 = \15). Five dollars stays in the parish and is paid to the celebrant of the mass, ten dollars is forwarded to a priest (retired or not retired) who is in need of mass intentions or is in mission lands where mass intentions are needed. This way, for every five dollars donated, a mass is said.

Please remember, this is one intention per five dollars donated. Examples may help: One intention is Edward Smith, or Mr. and Mrs. Edward Smith, or the Edward Smith Family. One intention is not Edward, Jane, Brent, and Sarah Smith. One intention is not Edward Smith, David Block, and Anna Dugas. One intention is not Mr. and Mrs. Edward Smith and Michael.

The priest can only receive mass offerings for one mass a day. If he says more than one mass a day, then the offerings for more than one mass a day are sent to the diocese to be deposited in the needy parishes’ fund. Also the offerings for the intention for one mass a day are part of the celebrant’s compensation. He pays federal and state income tax on it and he pays self-employment [FICA] tax on it.

We can only receive mass intention offerings for what can be said within a year. Since the Council of Trent, the general rule in the church is one intention per mass. The systems of Collective Intentions and of Group Intentions are exceptions to the rule of the church. These exceptions can be suppressed. One intention per mass is the rule of the church. The Collective Intentions system is an exception given by a 1991 Decree of the Congregation for the Clergy. The Group Intentions system is an exception given by the Bishops of Lafayette. Regardless of which system we use - within each system, the offering for one intention is used.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Q: Why do some sacraments leave a character or mark on the soul? Don't all sacraments affect the soul?

A: All sacraments mediate grace and connect us to Christ and to the Church. Some sustain us in our faith journey, while others help us heal from the effects of sin. Each one offers a share in God's life, giving us what we need to be faithful followers of Jesus. But some sacraments change us in ways that are irreversible. The three sacraments that leave a character are Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Orders. We are literally different people because of the effect of the grace of those sacraments. We are changed at the core of our being in such a fundamental way that we can not go back to what we once were.

In Baptism, we are freed from original sin, initiated into the Body of Christ as adopted sons and daughters. In Confirmation, we are given the fullness of God's Spirit, sealed in his grace and gifted with what we need to live a Christian life. In Holy Orders, a priest is marked as an 'alter Christus,' another Christ, and is once and forever a priest who offers sacrifice, forgives sin, and acts in the person of Christ. In these three sacraments, we are conformed more closely to Christ, reflecting his love and truth.
